MINUTES FROM PREVIOUS MEETINGS

The Board voted unanimously to approve minutes of the March 11, 2011 Elevator Installation, Repair and Maintenance Work Examining Board meeting.

APPLICATIONS

Julio J. Aguasvivas, Windsor Locks, CT – (R-7) Limited Conveyor Contractor – Denied

The Board voted unanimously to deny Mr. Aguasvivas' application due to lack of required notarized statement from his employing (R-7) Limited Conveyor Contractor license holder attesting to his dates and duties of employment as an (R-8) Limited Conveyor Journeyman, and a copy of his (R-8) Limited Conveyor Journeyman license.

Mark D. Dygert, Easley, S. Carolina – (R-8) Limited Conveyor Journeyman – Denied

The Board voted unanimously to deny Mr. Dygert's application due to lack of required notarized statement from his employing (R-7) Limited Conveyor Contractor license holder attesting to his dates and duties of employment, and copy of his school transcripts related to completed courses in (mechanical, electrical, conveyor and safety training).

William L. Hawthorne, Jr., Hadlyme, CT – (R-5) Limited Accessibility Contractor – Denied

The Board voted unanimously to deny Mr. Hawthorne's application due to lack of a required (R-6) Limited Accessibility Journeyman license for a minimum of two years.

William A. Johnson, North Branford, CT – (R-1) Unlimited Contractor – Tabled

The Board voted unanimously to table Mr. Johnson's application, contingent upon receipt of required notarized statement from his employing (R-1) Unlimited Contractor license holder attesting to his dates and duties of employment as an (R-2) Unlimited Journeyman.

Mark E. Malota, Milford, CT – (R-7) Limited Conveyor Contractor – Denied

The Board voted unanimously to deny Mr. Malota's application due to lack of a required (R-8) Limited Conveyor Journeyman license for a minimum of two years.

Scott T. Sneyd, Taunton, MA – (R-7) Limited Conveyor Contractor – No Action

Board denied Mr. Sneyd's application at their 3/14/11 meeting due to lack of required notarized statement from his employing (R-7) Limited Conveyor Contractor license holder attesting to his dates and duties of employment as an (R-8) Limited Conveyor Journeyman. The Board also requested verification of credentials regarding his occupational related experience and school related instruction experience that qualified him for the (R-8) Limited Conveyor Journeyman exam.

Mr. Sneyd did not appear today and the Board took no action.

Stanislav Stefanov, Ft. Mill, S. Carolina – (R-8) Limited Conveyor Journeyman - Denied

The Board voted unanimously to deny Mr. Stefanov's application due to lack of required notarized statement from his employing (R-7) Limited Conveyor Contractor license holder attesting to his dates and duties of employment, and copy of his school transcripts related to completed courses in (mechanical, electrical, conveyor and safety training).

Sebastian Thies, Vernon, CT – (R-7) Limited Conveyor Contractor – Denied

The Board voted unanimously to deny Mr. Thies' application due to lack of a required (R-8) Limited Conveyor Journeyman license for a minimum of two years.

The Board voted unanimously to table Mr. Crossman's application, contingent upon receipt of required notarized statement from his employing (R-5) Limited Accessibility Contractor license holder attesting to his dates and duties of employment, and copy of his school transcripts related his occupational school instruction experience.

Kevin J. Dion, Webster, MA – (R-6) Limited Accessibility Journeyman – Tabled

The Board voted unanimously to table Mr. Dion's application, contingent upon receipt of required notarized statement from his employing (R-5) Limited Accessibility Contractor license holder attesting to his dates and duties of employment, and copy of his school transcripts related his occupational school instruction experience.

Jose G. doCurral, Milford, MA – (R-6) Limited Accessibility Journeyman – Tabled

The Board voted unanimously to table Mr. doCurral's application, contingent upon receipt of required notarized statement from his employing (R-5) Limited Accessibility Contractor license holder attesting to his dates and duties of employment, and copy of his school transcripts related his occupational school instruction experience.

The Board denied Mr. Morrison's application at their 1/10/11 meeting due to lack of required notarized statement from his employing (R-7) Limited Conveyor Contractor license holder attesting to his dates and duties of employment, copy of his school transcript regarding his occupational school instruction related experience and a copy of the course curriculum.

After further review of Mr. Morrison's application at today's meeting, the Board voted unanimously to table his application, contingent upon receipt of required notarized statement from his employing (R-7) Limited Conveyor Contractor license holder attesting to his dates and duties of employment, and copy of his school transcripts related to completed courses in (mechanical, electrical, conveyor and safety training).

George D. Parker, Monson, MA – (R-8) Limited Conveyor Journeyman – Tabled

The Board denied Mr. Parker's application at their 1/10/11 meeting due to lack of required notarized statement from his employing (R-7) Limited Conveyor Contractor license holder attesting to his dates and duties of employment, copy of his school transcript regarding his occupational school instruction related experience and a copy of the course curriculum.

After further review of Mr. Parker's application at today's meeting, the Board voted unanimously to table his application, contingent upon receipt of required notarized statement from his employing (R-7) Limited Conveyor Contractor license holder attesting to his dates and duties of employment, and copy of his school transcripts related to completed courses in (mechanical, electrical, conveyor and safety training).

John Paykowski, Longmeadow, MA – (R-8) Limited Conveyor Journeyman – Tabled

The Board denied Mr. Paykowski's application at their 1/10/11 meeting due to lack of required notarized statement from his employing (R-7) Limited Conveyor Contractor license holder attesting to his dates and duties of employment, copy of his school transcript regarding his occupational school instruction related experience and a copy of the course curriculum.

After further review of Mr. Paykowski's application at today's meeting, the Board voted unanimously to table his application, contingent upon receipt of required notarized statement from his employing (R-7) Limited Conveyor Contractor license holder attesting to his dates and duties of employment, and copy of his school transcripts related to completed courses in (mechanical, electrical, conveyor and safety training).

David M. Rice, Thorndike, MA – (R-8) Limited Conveyor Journeyman – Tabled

The Board denied Mr. Rice's application at their 1/10/11 meeting due to lack of required notarized statement from his employing (R-7) Limited Conveyor Contractor license holder attesting to his dates and duties of employment, copy of his school transcript regarding his occupational school instruction related experience and a copy of the course curriculum.

After further review of Mr. Rice's application at today's meeting, the Board voted unanimously to table his application, contingent upon receipt of required notarized statement from his employing (R-7) Limited Conveyor Contractor license holder attesting to his dates and duties of employment, and copy of his school transcripts related to completed courses in (mechanical, electrical, conveyor and safety training).

OLD BUSINESS - BOARD TO CREATE CURRICULUM OUTLINE FOR (R-7) - (R-10)

The Board created a sub-committee at their January 10, 2011 meeting to establish a school related instruction core content curriculum outline for (R-7) through (R-10) elevator license categories due to lack of an established apprenticeship training program for such categories. The Board voted the following sub-committee members: John DeRosa, Paul Farnsworth and Joseph Bayusik.

Limited conveyor contractor's license (R-7).

The holder of this license may perform only work limited to installation, maintenance, alteration or repair of equipment, apparatus or machines used to convey materials. Such conveyors shall be permanently or temporarily placed and of a fixed nature. The holder of this license may not perform work on any freight elevator. The requirements to qualify for this license examination shall be two (2) years as a properly licensed journeyman or equivalent experience and training.

Limited conveyor journeyman's license (R-8).

The holder of this license may perform only work limited to installation, maintenance, alteration or repair of equipment, apparatus or machines used to convey materials and only while in the employ of a contractor licensed for such work. Such conveyors shall be permanently or temporarily placed and of a fixed nature. The holder of this license may not perform work on any freight elevator. The requirements to qualify for this license examination shall be the completion of a registered apprenticeship program or equivalent experience and training.

Limited hoist, cranes and lifts contractor's license (R-9).

The holder of this license may perform only work limited to installation, maintenance, alteration or repair of equipment, apparatus or machines used to hoist or lift materials. Such hoists, lifts or cranes, including, but not limited to, monorails, under hung cranes, overhead hoists, top running single girder cranes with under hung hoists and double girder cranes with top running hoists shall be permanently or temporarily placed and of a fixed nature. The holder of this license may not perform work on any freight elevator. The requirements to qualify for this license examination shall be two (2) years as a properly licensed journeyman or equivalent experience and training. This license does not apply to a crane as defined in section 29-221 of the Connecticut General Statutes and regulated by the examining board for crane operators.

Limited hoist, cranes and lifts journeyperson's license (R-10).

The holder of this license may perform only work limited to installation, maintenance, alteration or repair of equipment, apparatus or machines used to hoist or lift materials and only while in the employ of a contractor licensed for such work. Such hoists, lifts or cranes, including, but not limited to, monorails, under hung cranes, overhead hoists, top running single girder cranes with under hung hoists and double girder cranes with top running hoists shall be permanently or temporarily placed and of a fixed nature. The holder of this license may not perform work on any freight elevator. This license does not apply to a crane as defined in section 29-221 of the Connecticut General Statutes and regulated by the examining board for crane operators. The requirements to qualify for this license examination shall be the completion of a registered apprenticeship or helper program or equivalent experience and training.
