1.	<p><u>CLEAR: Choosing Life: Empowerment! Action! Results</u> CLEAR is an evidence-based, health promotion intervention for males and females living with HIV/AIDS and high risk HIV-negative individuals. CLEAR is a client-centered program delivered one-on-one using cognitive behavioral techniques to change behavior. 3.	<p><u>MPowerment</u> MPowerment is a community level Intervention for young men who have sex with men (MSM). <p>4.</p>	<p><u>Outreach, Testing, and Linkage (OTL)</u> OTL includes targeted outreach that includes HIV testing and linkage to other services, as appropriate. <p>5.</p>	<p><u>Personalized Cognitive Counseling (PCC)</u> PCC is an individual-level, single session counseling intervention for men who have sex with men (MSM) who are repeat testers for HIV. PCC focuses on the person’s self-justification (thoughts, attitudes and beliefs) he uses when deciding whether or not to engage in high risk sexual behavior. <p>7.</p>	<p><u>Community Promise</u> Community PROMISE is a community level HIV/STD prevention intervention that relies on role model stories and peer advocates from the community. Community PROMISE begins with a community identification process to collect and analyze information about the community. <p>9.</p>	<p><u>WILLOW (Women Involved in Life Learning from Other Women)</u> The WILLOW intervention is a small-group, social-skills training and educational intervention for heterosexual adult women, regardless of race or ethnicity, who are living with HIV/AIDS. WILLOW is delivered in four 4-hour sessions and emphasizes gender pride, informs women how to identify and maintain supportive social networks, teaches coping strategies to reduce life stressors, and enhances awareness of STD transmission and HIV reinfection risk behaviors.</p> <p>Funded Contractor:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • UCONN/CCMC, Hartford, CT (860-679-5439)
