

## ***Connecticut's Implementation of the American Recovery and Reinvestment Act of 2009 – July 2010 Quarterly Report***

### **Jobs:**

- Recovery Act jobs created/retained during the quarter (April 1 – June 30) = **7,575** (compared to 6,627 on March 31, 2010)
- Recovery Act job numbers for the reporting period (April 1 – June 30), by sector:

Education	5842.4
Labor/Training	142.33
Transportation/Environment	938.7
Public Safety	41.38
Energy	244.34
Community Services	353.9
Other	12.41

### **Funds:**

- Recovery Act funds that have come into CT including entitlement programs (FMAP, SNAP, Unemployment) = \$3,363,485,133
- Recovery Act funding through grants = \$1,452,240,563
- Grant expenditures = \$635,902,240 (compared to \$423,859,516 on March 31, 2010)
- Total dollars going out (combined totals between Recovery Act grant expenditures and Recovery Act entitlement benefits) = \$2,708,404,361

## **Transportation**

- Transportation jobs, raw numbers = 13,400 individuals employed on transportation projects funded by the Recovery Act since February 2009
- Number of highway/bridge projects under contract = 111
- Number of transportation projects completed = 22
- Amount outlayed for transportation projects = \$119,021,190

## **Health and Environment**

- Number of children receiving rotavirus vaccinations = 11,000
- Number of rotavirus doses administered = 23,059
- Drinking Water projects – status:
  - Number of drinking water projects = 12
  - Number of projects underway = 10
  - Number of projects completed = 2
- Clean Water projects – status:
  - Number of projects: 4 combined sewer overflow projects and 1 electrical generation project
  - Number of projects underway = 5

## **Education**

- Number of grants Education has made = more than 900 grants awarded to school districts
- Education dollars awarded to towns/LEAs = more than \$400 million sent out to school districts

## **Public Safety**

- Number of ICAC cases opened = 227 investigations conducted and arrested 19 individuals
- Number of ICAC training sessions = 66 presentations to 5665 individuals; Computer Crimes Unit has trained more than 500 law enforcement officers
- DNA profiles processed = 20,600 convicted offender samples have been processed and entered into the CODIS databank
- Number of communities receiving JAG = more than 155

### **Research**

- Number of grants received by UConn = 108 grants for \$40 million

### **Energy**

- Energy efficiency projects in state buildings = 12 projects for \$5 million

  - Number of units fully weatherized = more 1,300
  - Number of units audited = more than 2,000
